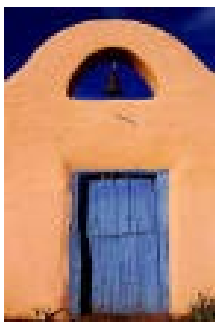

1. Taos Day Tour with Lunch



Take a trip to the charming town of Taos. On the way to Taos see the enchanting San Francisco de Assisi Church in Ranchos de Taos, made famous by many artists including Georgia O'Keeffe. Next is Taos Pueblo framed by the sacred Taos Mountains. Taos Pueblo has been designated a World Heritage Site, indicating its world cultural importance. Taos Pueblo is on the National Historic Register, and remains in its pristine, traditional state. Head to Taos Plaza for time to shop and lunch on your own. After lunch journey down the "High Road" to the rustic Hispanic village of Chimayo, in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains. Your first stop will be at the charming Santuario de Chimayo, known as the "Lourdes of the Southwest," so named because of the professed healing powers contained in the earth in which a crucifix was discovered, and subsequently became the site where the Santuario was built. If time permits, stop at Centinela, where seven generations of the Trujillo family have produced their spectacular Spanish-style weavings. Pricing includes transportation, guide, entrance fees, bottled water on board, donations to churches and driver and guide gratuities.

1. Easy Hike to Tent Rocks



Join us for an easy hike to the unique geological area known as Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks. Tent Rocks is an area that features large, tent-shaped rocks that hug the steep cliffs of Peralta Canyon. These rocks were created by the powerful forces of vulcanism and erosion, which have built up and then torn down this landscape. While uniform in shape, the tent rock formations vary in height from a few feet to 90 feet. Most of the trail is on a gradual sloping include through a slot canyon. A steep climb to the top of the mesa is available at the end of the trail for those interested. Please bring layered clothing and good walking shoes. Includes transportation, guide, bottled water and entrance fees.

2. Bandelier Tour

Travel northwest out of Santa Fe to Bandelier National Monument and descend into a canyon filled with the ruins of the Anasazi Indians, colloquially "the Ancient Ones."



Located on the Pajarito Plateau of the Jemez Mountains, Bandelier was the home of the Anasazi from the eleventh to fourteenth centuries. Excavated over 90 years ago, these ruins were once home to over 200 people, ancestors of today's Pueblo Indians. Walk along easy paths beyond the remains of ancient Pueblo dwellings, to the cliff where you can climb ladders to peer inside. If time permits, take a walk further up the path that leads to the Ceremonial Cave, where the Anasazi and later descendants held spiritual rites and celebrations. Pricing includes transportation, entry to monument and pueblo, guide, cooler with bottled water, and driver and guide gratuities.
